
SUSTAINABILITY INITIATIVE

Our commitment to the Slow Food movement includes taking actionable steps toward environmental stewardship and community engagement. By implementing a sustainability initiative for Terra Madre Americas in Sacramento, we are not only showcasing a vibrant food movement—we are affirming our shared responsibility to protect the environment that sustains it. In the first year of implementing our sustainability program, we are focused on laying the groundwork for long-term impact and accountability. Our key goals include:

Create a Positive Impact

• Ensure our events leave a lasting, positive impression on host venues and local communities by prioritizing sustainability

Develop and Implement a Sustainability Program

 Establish a comprehensive program that includes clear guidelines, practices, and metrics aligned with environmental and social responsibility

Engage Our Network

 Involve partners, stakeholders, vendors, staff, volunteers, and community members in the planning and execution of sustainability efforts, fostering a shared commitment

Communicate and Evaluate

 Set measurable goals and regularly report on both successes and areas for improvement. Transparency and reflection will help us build a more effective and resilient program over time

PLEASE COMMIT TO THE FOLLOWING PRACTICES:

- Reduce waste in all packaging and shipping
- Purchase in bulk, when possible, to minimize packaging and transportation emissions
- Use sustainable, reusable, or compostable products especially items made from organic materials (e.g., PLA #7, derived from corn or potatoes) — instead of single-use items.
- Recycle materials such as aluminum foil, paper, cardboard, aluminum cans, and glass, specifically those labeled with recycling codes #1 through #6
- Avoid non-recyclable or non-biodegradable products, such as Styrofoam
- Avoid single-use items, such as disposable plastic water bottles
- Sort waste into three distinct streams: landfill, recycling, and compost
- **Utilize sustainability stations** where available and encourage others to do the same.
- Consider the environmental impact of your transportation, production equipment, and infrastructure. Whenever possible, use sustainable or renewable energy sources (e.g., electric vehicles, solar light towers, clean-energy generators)
- Conduct business with environmentally responsible companies those who are committed to sustainable practices or have active sustainability plans

We believe sustainability is not an obstacle to success — it is one of our key goals and values.
